On Wednesday 27th April 2022, we will continue our series of young onset dementia webinars with Employabili-tea.

Researcher Dr Louise Ritchie will be joined by Martin Robertson and they will discuss issues relating to working after a diagnosis of young onset dementia.

Dr Ritchie has conducted research into understanding the experiences of people who are diagnosed while still in employment and exploring the potential for continued employment post-diagnosis.

All-Party Parliamentary Group on Dementia - social care workforce inquiry

The All-Party Parliamentary Group on Dementia, co-chaired by Debbie Abrahams MP and Baroness Greengross, is undertaking an inquiry into what people affected by dementia want and need from the social care workforce.

Evidence has been supplied to the inquiry from over 30 organisations, academics and charities - including the Young Dementia Network - and nearly 2000 people affected by dementia completed a questionnaire. At a recent evidence session, Trevor Saloman whose wife Yvonne has young onset Alzheimer's disease and Gaye Payne, who was diagnosed with young onset dementia in 2020, both shared their experiences with the group.

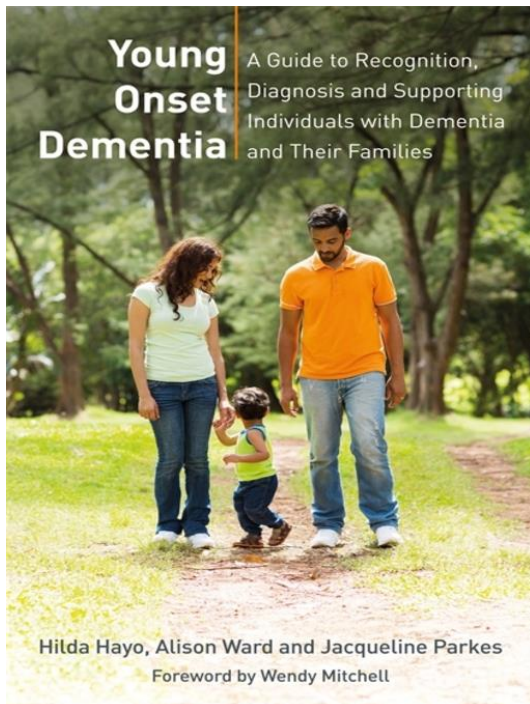

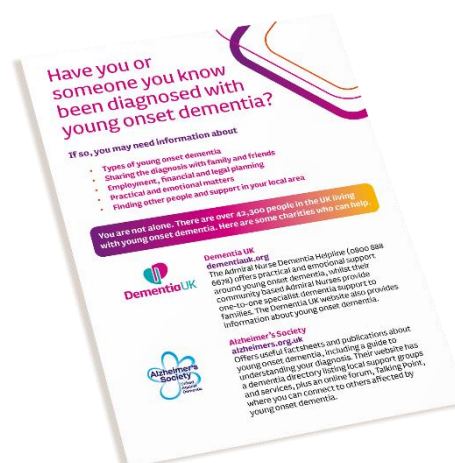
