**What is the purpose of the study?**

The purpose of this study is to explore the post-diagnostic services available to informal caregivers of people living with young onset dementia in the aftermath of Covid-19 and how they facilitate caregiver resilience.

**Who can take part?**

***Inclusion criteria:***

- *are an informal caregiver of someone who has a diagnosis of young onset dementia*
- *Aged 18+ and can give informed consent*
- *Have access to the video conferencing software Zoom*
- *Can understand English language to a degree where you are able to understand the information provided and answer questions asked during the interview.*
- *Received young onset dementia diagnosis during Covid-19*

**What will happen if I take part?**

If you decide to take part you will attend an interview session lasting approximately 45 minutes via Zoom (online video call software). If you agree to take part, you will be interviewed on a one-to-one basis about your experiences of being an informal caregiver. Participation is entirely voluntary, and you can decide to withdraw from the research at any time.

**Potential benefits of the research:**

**This research will add to the body of research about the post diagnostic services available to informal caregivers of people living with young onset dementia and how these services help facilitate caregiver resilience.**
