Dementia Carers Count - 'Invisible' report




Dementia Carers Count has launched a report, 'Invisible', which shares findings from its 2023 annual survey.

Over 1,300 dementia carers took part in the survey sharing their experiences of caring for someone living with dementia. They spoke about their desperate need for emotional and practical support to help them cope with the complexities of caring, and said they felt unseen, unheard and unsupported.
